Logging Software

- N3FJP FD Logging software
- Connected with cable
- Each station will have a logging computer
- One database collects all the data.
- Database computer will display summary and totals
- The summary will be on the web site for you to look at from home. (maybe)

Operation

Search and Pounce.

Dial up and down the band looking for contacts.

You can be selective who you contact

Useful in contests where multipliers are ARRL sections, DX zones, and other selective categories, because you can hunt for specific multipliers to increase your score

You can avoid stations with big pileups, which waste your time and reduce your Q rate (contact, or QSO, rate per minute or hour)

Slow Process

Sitting on one frequency

You never know who will answer May not work as many multipliers

Usually can work a lot more stations (more points, higher Q rate)

Easy to do with voice recorder

May have to handle pileup if you're a rare multiplier Can get tiring if you call by voice and no one answers

Find a frequency and start calling CQ. Makes the most contacts

Take as many contacts before giving the frequency up.


BE NICE but keep going. **QRZed**. This is W4GR calling CQ Field Day 8A Georgia.

AGAIN, ----- thank you,73 QRZed.

When the band shifts, you may hear people calling CQ, make the contact.

Continue calling CQ. If they fuss, apologize.

Move up or down 5KHZ. To clear frequency and call.






